We have been learning about different fruits and thinking about what different shops sell. We focused on the Baker's this week.

In cognition we have also been doing some counting and some science learning about different vehicles and the sounds they make.

We also did some sensory play with some different materials including cornflour, foam chips and feathers.

In PSHE we looked at how to keep safe and who to talk to if we didn't feel safe. Our RE focused on the story of St Francis and his love of animals and we learn about Rosary Beads in Assembly.

Through activities and games, we talked about how children learn to live together and respect differences at school, in their family and in their entire social environment. Everyone has their own way of understanding, thinking, acting, expressing and presenting themselves in the world.

In Mathematics we talked about quantity using the qualities of each person.

In Art, we used the Maizena flour paste (flour made in Brazil). We built puppets with different colours and shapes and the children really loved it.

We wrote sentences in different languages and children could colour different eye colours, skin colours, hair types and colours.

In food tech we had Italian pasta with white sauce. The children enjoyed the Italian music and heard a few words in Italian and we had a "Pasta Party" which was really fun!

We also had a long moment of reflection and conversation to talk about whether they felt safe or not and what they could do if they are not feeling safe. The children were focused and interested in this topic. After the talk, they all had the opportunity to answer questions, choosing the images that showed their feelings.

In RE lesson we talked about Rosary and we prayed and asked Mary our mother to protect us and protect our school and all the children and young people.

Stirling Class

This week Stirling have finished reading 'The Twits' by Roald Dahl as requested by a student. We have completed some creative exercises based on the characters and continued work on adjectives.

In Maths the students have continued working on rounding up numbers to the nearest 10 or 100 and ordering numbers up to 5 digits depending on ability.

In Art we created or coloured in superhero characters for our display.

The students started a mini project about the Crusades in our continued work on English history.

The students carried out some experiments with colours in science. We created colour lava lamps with oil and effervescent tablets and investigated surface tension with milk, food colouring and washing up liquid.

The students also continued work on personal finance and looked at the advantages of saving money.

In P.S.H.E. we created a poster about keeping safe and who the students can talk to if something or someone makes them feel unsafe or uncomfortable.
