This will form part of a large collage of completed cards from around the school, making it an impressive art installation. Students continued to shine in their literacy lesson, being able to creat examples and analyse in a story, a narrative and explanation. For maths, students have reached the stage where they have designed their own research questions, carried out a survey and created a table of results showing frequency and findings. Food tech has remained a summer theme with the group creating a wonderful Eton mess and fruit salad which as you can imagine, was devoured in no time. For topic, the group is one step closer to preparing for their Stansted Airport trip by having learned about important documents and procedures needed for travelling abroad.
