For road safety, the learners used team work to observe each other walk around the site. They were making sure that each other found a safe place to cross and looked both ways when crossing the roads. Each learner started with 100 points. If they forgot to look or did not find a safe space, such as a looking to cross the road, 5 points were deducted. Learners had a look at a car to see if they could correctly identify which direction the car was going in when its indicators were flashing and what the hazard warning lights meant.

Each class were shown around a vehicle and were given a demonstration of the car horn. Many of us jumped when the horn was sounded but everyone was able to identify that they needed to watch out for potential danger should they hear that sound. Everyone did brilliantly and some learners even kept all of their points. It was interesting watching the learners give each other critical feedback which supported their learning. A certificate was presented to them with a score of how well they did.



Online Safety by Vicki

The learners have been learning about online safety. Each class had a mini quiz to complete to show their prior knowledge of online safety. We all had a discussion and addressed any misconceptions following the quiz results. We considered who are the groups of people we should / should not be sharing personal details with, including our passwords; bank details; and our home address.

The learners made a poster to show their learning. They used symbols, pictures and words to communicate their learning. The posters reinforced:

- Being respectful to all people online
- Not sharing personal information with strangers- Only talking to trusted people they know online when using social media
- Visiting safe websites

Every learner was able to communicate that they should tell a trusted adult if they saw something that upset or worried them when using a computer or other electronic device. The learners were able to refer to previous work they had done in Prevent sessions about the people in their circle of trust (e.g. family, friends, staff).

Group 1 & 2 Enrichment Trip

On Monday 12th February Group 1 and 2 went to Hartham Common in Hertford. We were very lucky as it was a very bright and beautiful day. The learners explored the Common. They saw a river, ducks, a waterfall and lots of dog walkers. It was an opportunity for the learners to spend time with their peers in a community setting. After a very long walk (of nearly 7000 steps!) there was time for the learners to sit in the sunshine and have a picnic lunch before returning to college. Upon their return to college, the learners viewed their photographs and completed an evaluation form about their trip. Everyone reported that they enjoyed it and would like to return again.



Pancake race

On Tuesday 13th February, the college staff (Robinne & Joe) took part in our first pancake race at St Elizabeth's against other staff members from the organisation. Learners learnt all about Shrove Tuesday and why it is a memorable date for us, and not just about Pancakes but marking the start of Lent. The learners came along and cheered their lecturer and LSA on with joy and excitement! Even the rain did not stop them from being fantastic cheerleaders!

Departments all across the centre got involved and took part in a relay race. The competition was fierce, unfortunately College did not win but as we always say - it's the taking part that counts!

Ash Wednesday

On Wednesday 14th February, the learners attended the chapel service for Ash Wednesday. Father Paul delivered a lovely service, using the ash to bless learners and staff with a cross on their forehead. The learners kept this on for the rest of the day as a mark of respect.
