Following our successful launch of Earwig that allows us to share the wonderful daily experiences of your young people, we have decided to move our weekly newsletter to monthly.


The monthly editions will be sent out and uploaded to the school website at the end of each month, starting at the end of March.

One towards our theme of exploring dishes from different cities and the other, making soup for our CAFOD food day. Katsu curry was first on the list followed by a European inspired vermicelli soup. In RE, the students are working on sequencing of the story of the resurrection of Jesus. In PE, Winston class practiced their cricket techniques.
