Stirling Class

Stirling class have continued to work hard this week.

We continued looking at our money skills in numeracy and all students can now recognise all UK coins and notes, and some students are able to work out how much things cost and how much change they should expect in return. We also did some measuring and were able to compare items. Two students also did a daily temperature taking task and recorded this to better understand how to record and analyse temperatures.

Students also learnt about hazards and dangers they can face in the home and around the school.

On Friday, we learned in detail about the Story of Easter, and then did some interesting related activities.

Students continue to watch Newsround each day, so they have an idea of what is happening in the world around them, which we then discuss.

We are all looking forward to a nice and well deserved break over Easter.
